Andrea Whitsett is Director at Morrison Institute for Public Policy, an applied research institute at Arizona State University. Previously, Whitsett held a variety of positions within the Institute including associate director, senior research analyst, and special projects manager. During her tenure, Whitsett guided the publication of numerous policy briefs as well as the Arizona Directions statewide report card. She has led the Institute's signature State of Our State Conference and helped launch the pilot Arizona Citizens' Initiative Review. Whitsett frequently presents key research findings to business executives, nonprofit leaders, and academics and has been interviewed by Horizon, KJZZ, Univision, Phoenix Business Journal, and Arizona Week.

Whitsett's passion for service traces back to her grandmother, Julieta Saucedo Bencomo, a community activist who in 1979 became the first Latina to serve on the Arizona State Board of Education. Whitsett graduated from Arizona State University with a Master's degree in Nonprofit Studies and has taught as a faculty associate in ASU's School of Community Resources and Development.
